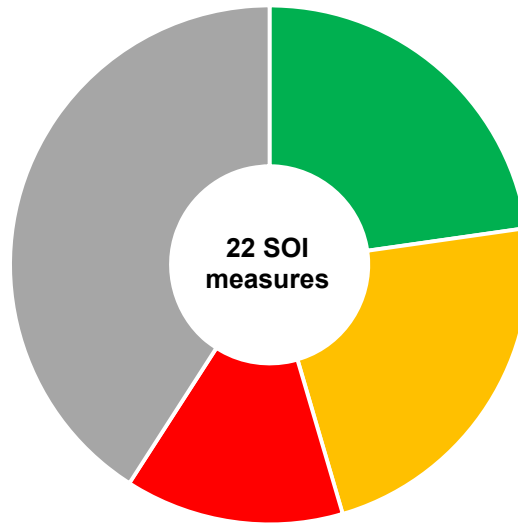

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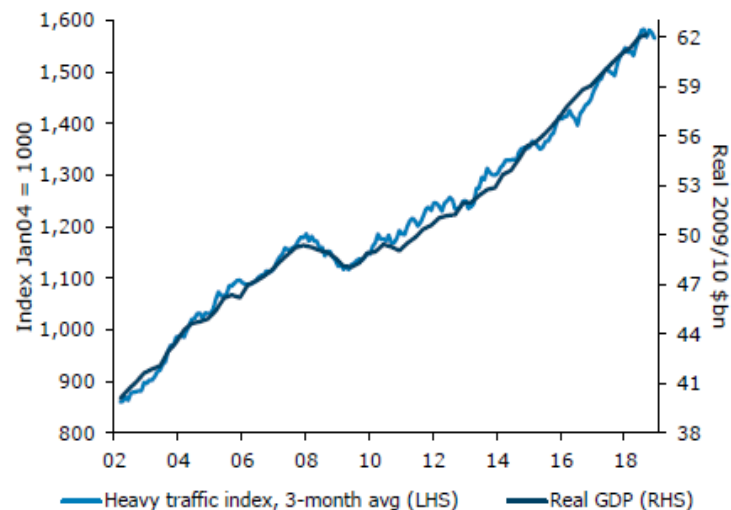

2.1 ANZ Truckometer

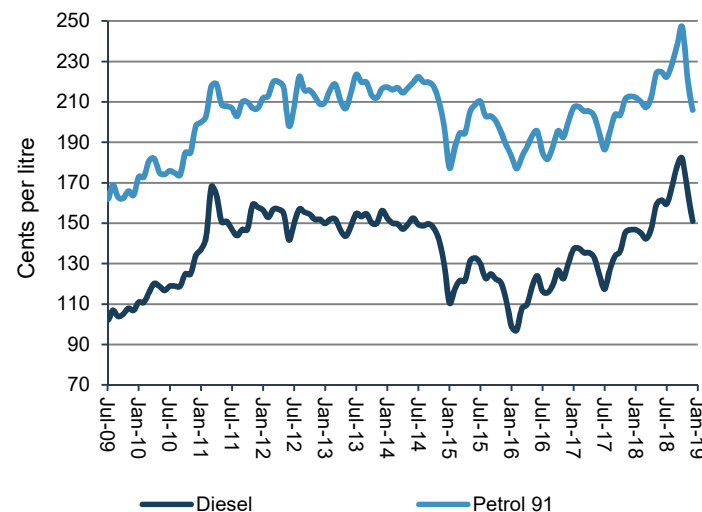


The ANZ Truckometer uses NZTA traffic data as an indicator of national economic activity.

The Heavy Traffic Index fell 4.1% m/m on top of a 2.3% fall in November. It is now suggesting modest Q4 GDP growth. It is too soon to call a change in trend, but clearly warning about a slower growth path for the New Zealand economy.

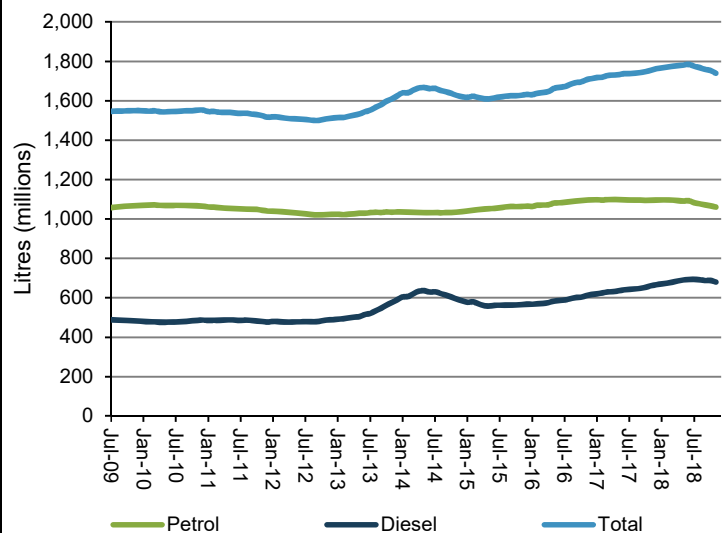
2.2 Monthly fuel prices



In December 2018 petrol prices were 3.2% lower and diesel prices were 3.0% higher compared to December 2017.

2.3 Auckland fuel sales (12 month rolling totals)

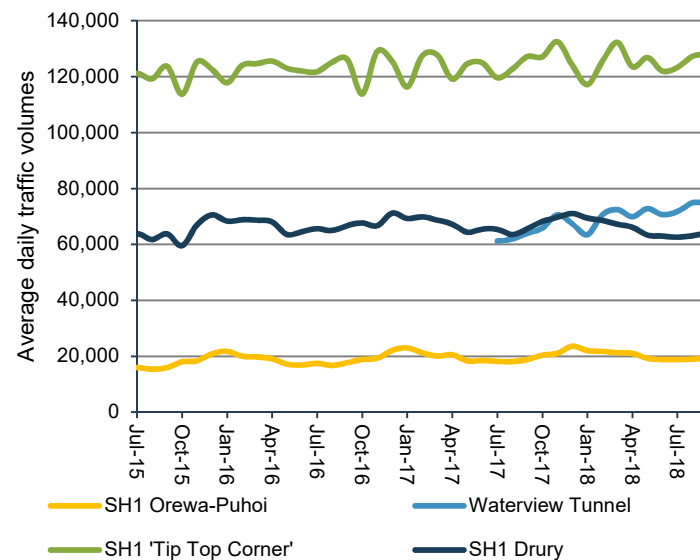


Total fuel sales for the 12 months to November 2018 were 0.9% lower than the 12 months to November 2017.

Petrol sales for the 12 months to November 2018 were 3.1% lower and diesel sales 2.8% higher than the 12 months to November 2017.

2.4 State Highway average daily traffic volumes



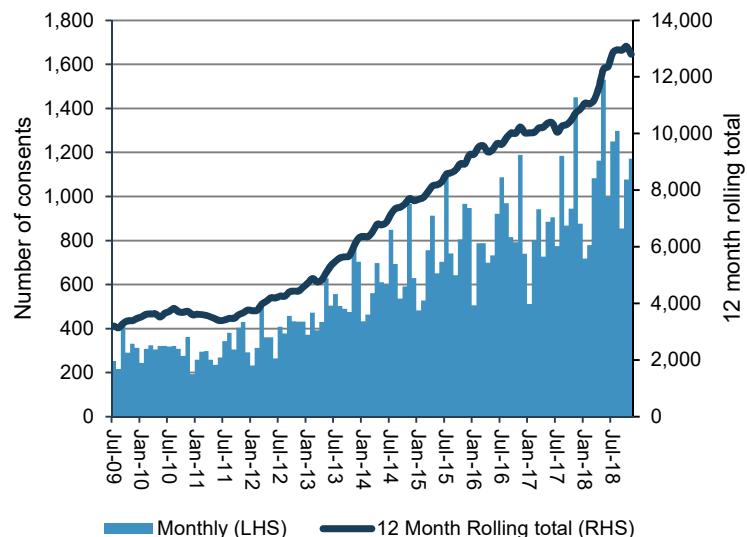
Compared to December 2017, average daily traffic volumes in December 2018 were down 5% on SH1 at Drury, down 2% on SH1 at Tip Top Corner, and down 3% on SH1 between Orewa and Puhoi.

Traffic volumes at Waterview Tunnel were 10% higher in December 2018 than in December 2017.

2.5 Auckland dwelling consents issued

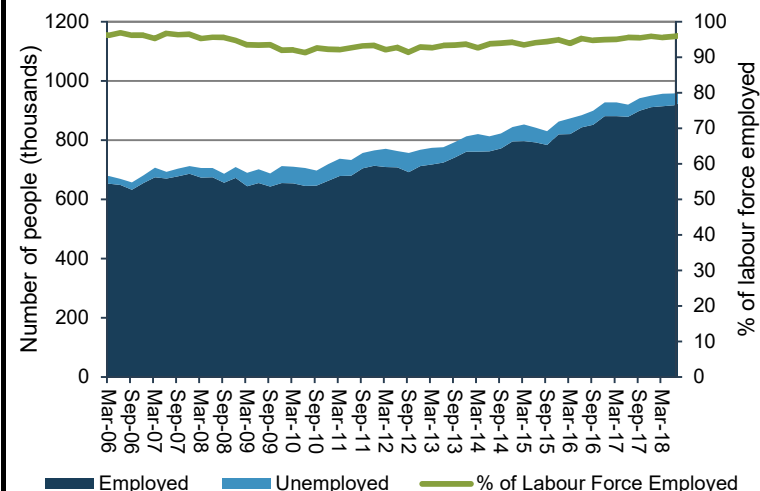


1,172 consents were issued in November 2018, a decrease of 19.2% on November 2017.

The 12 month rolling total to November 2018 was 12,800, 19.3% higher than the 12 months to November 2017.

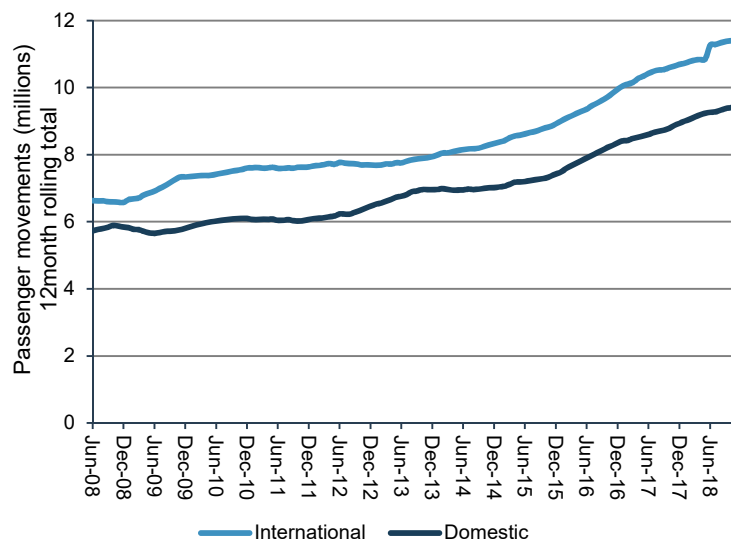
2.6 Auckland labour force



Auckland employment in the September 2018 quarter totalled 933,300, up 3.9% on September 2017.

2.7 Auckland Airport passenger movements

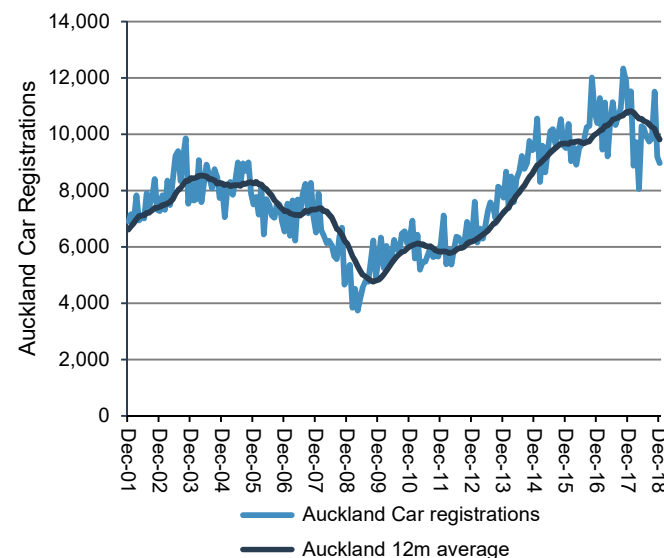


A total of 20.8 million passenger movements were recorded through Auckland Airport in the 12 months to October 2018, an increase of 5.1% on the year to October 2017.

In the month of October 2018, international passenger numbers were up 2.0% and domestic passengers up 3.0% compared to October 2017.

2.8 Auckland car registrations



This graph shows the number of cars first registered to an Auckland postal code.

There were 8,980 Auckland car registrations in December 2018, 16.4% less than December 2017.

The 12 month rolling average in December 2018 was 9,817, 9.0% lower than in December 2017. Car registrations outside of Auckland decreased by 5.3% over this same period.

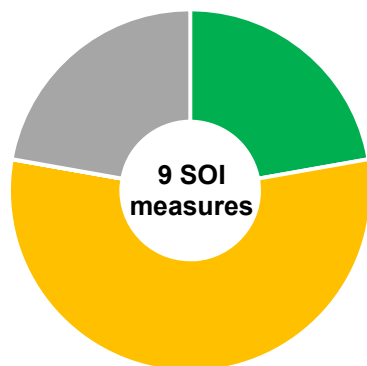
