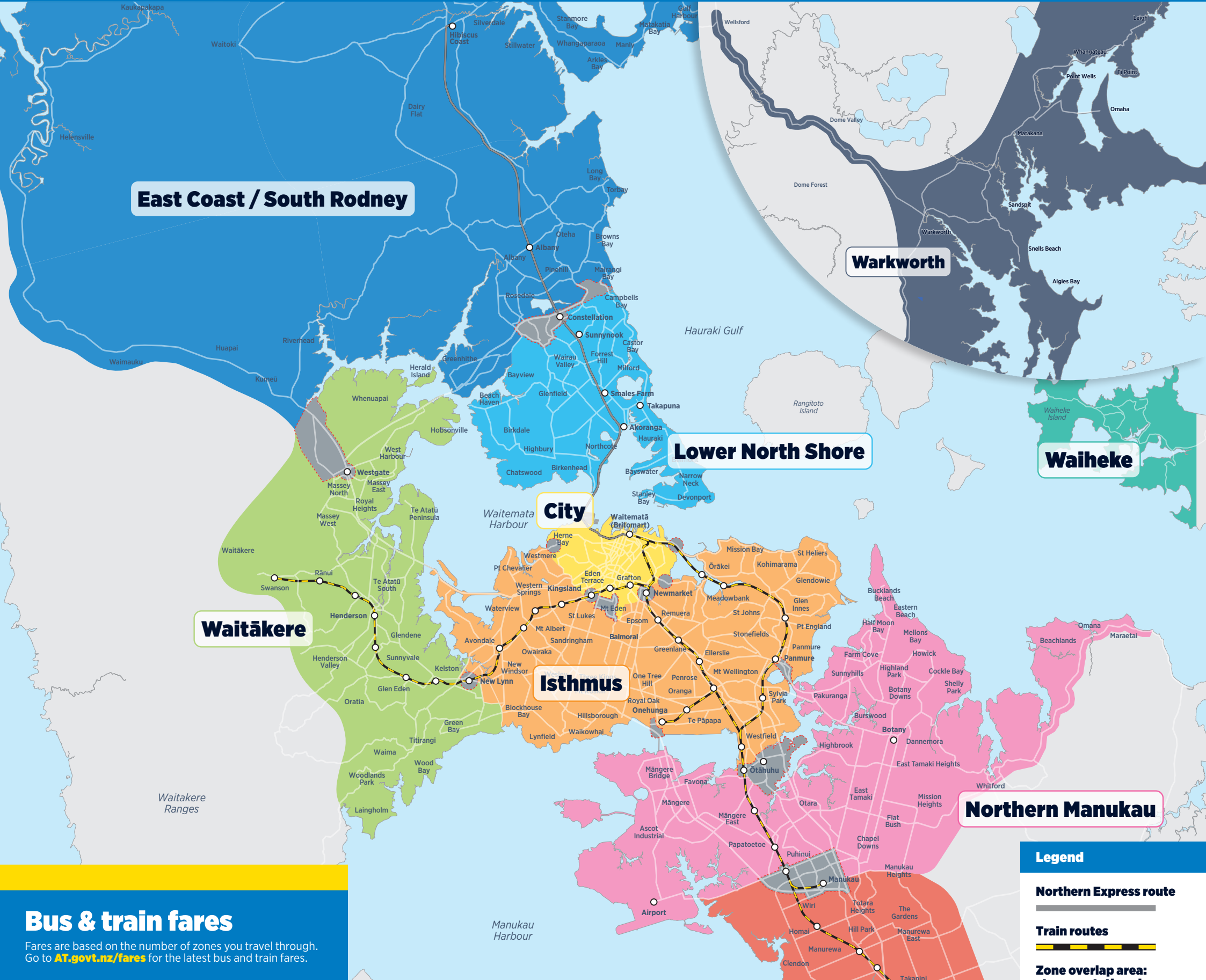


Bus & train fare zones



Bus & train fares

Fares are based on the number of zones you travel through. Go to [AT.govt.nz/fares](https://at.govt.nz/fares) for the latest bus and train fares.

Thanks for choosing to travel with us

Fares are cheaper if using an **AT HOP card**, contactless debit or credit card, or smart device than if paying with cash. AT HOP cards are reusable prepaid travel cards you can use on all AT buses, trains and ferries in Auckland.

You can buy a paper ticket at train stations and ferry terminals. Buses no longer accept cash payments.

How is your fare calculated?

Auckland is divided into 9 fare zones. Fares are calculated on how many zones you travel through, not how many trips you take. You can transfer between AT buses, trains and ferries and just pay one fare for the whole journey. Just make sure you tag on to your transfer within 30 minutes of tagging off from your last service using the same card or device, and that you complete your whole journey within four hours.

Tag on and off AT services by holding your AT HOP card, contactless credit or debit card, or smart device to the electronic readers on buses and at terminals at the start and finish of your journey. The reader beeps to tell you it's worked. Not tagging on and off can result in additional charges.

To find out your exact fare

Download the **AT Mobile app** or visit [AT.govt.nz/journeyplanner](https://at.govt.nz/journeyplanner). Otherwise count the number of zones you travel through to work out the cost of your journey.

Note: If you are travelling through the City Zone by train, you will not be charged for that zone if you do not tag on or off in it. Fares and discounts are current as at 2 February 2025.
